Grants Night of Kendall Community Op Shop

Kendall Community Op Shop held its 16th Annual Grants Presentation at 6pm on Thursday, 21st 2024 at the Kendall Services and Citizens Club, Kendall.

This all important and wonderful event has only possible because of all the 90 volunteers' dedication, enthusiasm, hard work, motivation endless efforts to use their talents in many different areas, their time and committed support of the Op Shop's aim to raise and distribute money to the community. It makes the volunteers proud for being part of the Kendall Op Shop's team!

Ensi Payne and Lesley Priest played violin music to welcome all arriving to attend this unique event.

After welcoming everyone to the presentation, Phillip Higgins, Chairperson of the Op Shop Grants Sub Committee, introduced guest presenter Cameron Marshall, breakfast radio presenter at ABC's Mid North Coast Radio.

An overview of the history of the Kendall Op Shop and its fund distribution was presented by Phil. The shop was first opened in 1995 and was run under the name of The Kendall Pool Committee for the purpose of raising funds towards the construction of the Kendall Community Pool and in 2004 -2020, the shop contributed \$ 400,000 towards the construction costs of the pool plus \$ 410,000 towards other improvements including PA System, Pool Heating, Lane Ropes, Shade Shelters and Wheelchair access and a tonight a new Inflatable Agua Pontoon.

It is.. the "Best resourced Community Pool in the Port Macquarie/Hastings area!" exclaimed Phil.

In 2008, the shop became known as the Kendall Community Op Shop, and the constitution was amended to allow the shop to apply funds to projects in the areas of Community, Sport and recreation and Arts and Culture, and to assist with the funding of major community projects. As well the shop was able to distribute funds to local Charities, to a total of 5% of its annual net profits. In 2023, this amount was increased to 15%.

In 2009 a Grants Programme was introduced and up to 2024 a Grand Total of \$1,799,101 has been distributed by the Kendall Community Op Shop over the past 16 years.

SCHOOLS PROGRAMME: Volunteer Co-ordinator Elaine Browning explained that this is an initiative of the Op Shop where 10 local schools have been allocated \$3,000 each for the year, to be used to assist students who may otherwise not be able to join in on extra activities offered or involved in by their school due to financial constraints or other disadvantage. These funds are to be made available on a needs basis, throughout the year. The programme was begun in 2023 and to date has been very well received.

Quotes and financial statements are required. Applications have an upper limit of \$ 30,000 and recipients are required to submit an evaluation form at the completion of their project.
