# Camden Haven Show... 74th Annual Event

The Camden Haven PAH&I Society Inc. is pleased to announce the success of the 74th Camden Haven Show, held last weekend on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> October. The event met with great excitement, outstanding attendance, and delightful weather, all of which point to growing community support for our local Show.

Visitors enjoyed a wide variety of entertainment and activities over the two-day event. The Demolition Derby held on Sunday evening (Thank you Isabella Hockey! - check it out on Facebook), Harrington's Circus Show with three shows each day, Pig Races, Chainsaw Racing, and the Woodchop State Championships were particular crowd favourites. Families flocked to the Billabong Zoo, marveled at Troppo Bob's Magic, listened to the live music, and cheered on the Port Macquarie Dog Club Agility Show. Alongside these, all the traditional Show competitions—including horse, cattle, dogs, arts and crafts, poultry, fruit and vegetables, flowers and plants, photography, and cooking—were strongly supported by participants and the community.

The Grand Parade was held on Saturday and our hard-working President Ron Porter welcomed our local politicians, MP Alison Penfold and MP Robert Dwver and also celebrated our long-standing life member, steward, and all-round great helper Pam McLeod who officially opened the Show.

The youngest competitor in the Poultry section, Delilah Fussell won the Grand Champion Bird of the Show with her outstanding rooster. See photo on right. With over 200 birds entered into the competition, the stewards were very happy with the support.

The horse events on Saturday and Sunday were great to watch, especially the show jumping and the sporting events where some super-duper juniors won places ahead of the adults in the open sections. Go the Juniors!

Traditional Devonshire Teas with red and white tablecloths, flowers, fancy crockery and mouth-watering scones with jam and fresh cream were enjoyed by customers in the Tea Rooms, along with food offered by the Canteen, the Steak Hut (Thank you to the Kendall Blues volunteers) and all the regular Show food, eg. Dagwood Dogs!

The Chainsaw Racing competition was hot and fast and noisy but also a crowd pleaser with some great fence posts created by the end.

The Woodchop competition co-ordinated by the North Coast Axemen's Association was a crowd pleaser, especially when a young woman outclassed five blokes at woodchopping!

# It's WORLD OP SHOP DAY on Saturday 18th October!

This is a new Australian initiative marking 100 years of use of the term "OP Shop", celebrating Op Shops' impact on the community and environment. Visit us on this day to shop for treasures!

The term "Op Shop' (short for Opportunity Shop) was reportedly created in 1925 by a former Melbourne showgirl Millie Tallis, who wanted to give charity stores a more positive and respectful label.

Times are challenging, cost of living is rising...we can help you make ends meet and also to keep to your budget, so shop at the Op Shop Kendall – it's great therapy for the soul too.

There is always a (popup) sale, come in and have a browse in the various sections, there might be even a range of reduced-priced collectables, so come in and browse for those special offers.

Our summer range of clothing is out on the racks...

The Op Shop provides a great way to avoid 'FAST FASHION' —
When too many new items are purchased for every new fashion-season. Check your wardrobe and be honest: how many have you never worn? Many 'FAST FASHION' clothes are no longer of long-lasting quality nor made out of skin-friendly or natural material. Buying second-hand (but often brand new and never worn) helps to counteract this trend of 'FAST FASHION'. Wear your clothes for two seasons, shop at the Op Shop and you help reduce the CO2-emmissons by up to 24 %. Declutter your closet's space which means share with someone out there who shops at the Op Shop.

The shop has a wonderful range of once worn (probably) formal and evening wear. Ask to see, the gowns are stored in the sorting room. Plenty of suits and jackets also.

#### Please donate wisely:

About 30 % of electrical items left at the shop are unsaleable and have to be put in the shop's landfill bin:

CD players that don't spin, radios that won't tune, food mixers with parts missing, missing power cords etc.. the Op Shop's biggest expense each month is the disposal cost for unsaleable donations which can't be recycled in some way.

#### **Hastings Education Fund.**

The Op Shop Kendall has made a decision to provide funds from 2026 to the Hastings Education Fund on an annual basis, for the purpose of establishing a Scholarship which will be available to a Camden Haven High School student for continuing education post High School.

- Friday, 31 October 2025 is Halloween a display of everything Halloween will be in the shop from 14th October. So buy your "scary" things cheaply from the Op Shop!
- Our famous Christmas display starts on Monday 3rd November 2025 make some time and come in and browse to shop at affordable prices for the festive season for the family and friends.

A small team of Volunteers gets together throughout the year but especially from October onwards to sort all the Christmas wares - it is a major task to prepare them for selling at the Op Shop from November until Christmas Eve. Donations often come in bundles, so everything has to be sorted by category, put themed items or by colours together and neatly packed into bags, or boxed in order to be presented in an attractive way to assist all those Santa's helpers.

Christmas goodies will include...

Angels, bauble packs, bon bons, candles, candle holders, cards, caps/clothes, hats, decorations for display at work/ office, schools and/or at home, figurines, garlands and wreaths, gift cards, glassware, kitchen items, lights, napkins, ornaments, wrapping paper, reindeers, ribbons, Santa items, soft toys, solar lights, table top decorations, tea towels, tinsels, tree decorations, tree stands... Just come in and browse, to create a festive mood by spending only a few dollars.

All volunteers are contributing their time and efforts to sales at the Op Shop to the next Grants Award night in May 2026. They are supporting the community. Around 90 volunteers give their time for many tasks at hand and try to give every customer what they are looking for as they assist to accommodate their requests. With their compassion – vision – sustainability they are not only volunteering at the Op Shop, many are completing more duties and contributing endless hours to sorting and labelling donations for selling. It's a great community within the community of Kendall.

# **Better By Bicycle Port Macquarie**

This month's Tuesday Trails featured Kew to Dunbogan, via North Haven Beach.

Commencing at 8:00am, 16 cyclists set forth from the Royal Hotel Kew carpark on the 36 kms, Grade 2 route.

The relatively flat route follows shared pathways, broken up in various places with a few hundred metres of road.

Unfortunately, they encountered their first obstacle quite early on. Upon entering the western end of Queens Lake track, they found it in very poor condition, almost inaccessible from Sirius Drive to the Sailing Club. Although the group persevered on the way in, later in the day, the return leg saw the decision to tackle the traffic instead. "That's a busy stretch of main road and we had to use it because of the poor condition of a purpose built track", lamented one rider. To further exacerbate the situation, there is only a shoulder on one side of the road, so they had to head into oncoming traffic. Thankfully, with skill and cautious road sense the group safely navigated the challenges. (Should 'challenges' really be potentially life-threatening?). Hopefully, this will be addressed by Council soon.

Luckily, that was the worst of it, as the rest of the journey was magnificent. They meandered along the picturesque lakeside boardwalk, which reached the border of Laurieton. One rider commented that she was seeing parts of the area she hadn't known existed. Arriving again on the main road, they had to travel a short distance before accessing the shared pathway over North Haven bridge, riding through the mangroves and ultimately following the Camden Haven foreshore towards the breakwall. Again, the decision was taken to ride the quiet back roads instead of the shared pathway, as the breakwall is far too dangerous at busy times. Retracing their steps back over the bridge, they hugged the waterline through Laurieton, and crossed the Laurieton bridge towards Dunbogan. Again, the bridge presented another danger spot, with a narrow pathway perched too close to traffic.

The group ultimately disembarked at the Dunbogan Boatshed & Marina where they were welcomed as regulars (this being their third visit in recent months). Sean & Sabine Coenraad manage the cafe Tuesdays/Wednesdays and quickly accommodated the 16 brightly dressed patrons. Sean said, "of course we know the locals, but now we're recognising the cycling groups as well. The B2B has opened up Dunbogan to everyone who wants to walk or cycle. We see entire families in hi-vis and helmets".

This particular group, 'Tuesday Trails with Stephanie', is the inspiration of Stephanie Todd. She said, "a local social bike group was needed for our demographic, say 45 to 85yrs old. I see people are isolated once they retire and they love this sort of social get together, which is active, fills them with

endorphins and they have a coffee with a bunch of new friends...".

# A voice from the past

## The Heidelberg artists

Frederick McCubbin (1855-1917) Tom Roberts (1856-1931) Arthur Streeton (1867-1943)

These three Australian artists are perhaps our better known artists, who formed a group of Impressionists calling themselves the Heidelberg School. In 1891 Arthur Streeton and Walter Withers (1854-1914) exhibited their paintings in Melbourne. Australia was fast heading towards C.1899 nationhood and land-

scape art in Australia was emerging and was being noticed. The style of open spaces vivid canvasses of sunlight with exotic fauna and flora had never been shown to European eyes , and it created much interest. The artists captured what they saw, the rough and raw land not romanticised as was the European art at that time.

The artists met and camped in tents, coming together to exchange ideas and philosophise, the result was work depicted as realistic and showed a young country confidently moving forward. So the Australian Impressionist landscape painting was born.

The artists painted many scenes on cigar box lids 9 by 5 inches and in one exhibition in Melbourne almost all were sold. Not many have survived today. The movement was a pivotal point in our history, critical to our culture and defining what it was to be Australian.

#### **Laurieton's rising Hot Shots**

Laurieton Tennis Club's ('LTC') implementation of Tennis Australia's Hot Shots Program is proving a huge success. The program, run by Evoke Tennis, is a modified learning pathway, with three graduating stages of development - Red Ball, Orange Ball and Green Ball. Children progress along the pathway using low-compression balls, a lower net and smaller court. The scoring system is also simplified. The primary aim is to allow more time between shots, enabling the young players to develop their strokes. The result is five or six year-olds with top spin forehands, two-handed backhands and complete service action.

In addition, LTC, in conjunction with Kempsey Tennis Club, is running the Evoke Tour, a series of 5 annual tournaments. These are specifically designed for 4 - 12 year olds, in the Hot Shots program. LTC's head coach and tournament organiser Quinn Sylow explains, "the Evoke Tour is an introduction to tournaments, breaking down the usual fear barrier". Evoke's latest tournament ran in September and attracted 34 players, primarily from Laurieton and Kempsey. This was the first tournament for many of the young competitors with the event being an overwhelming success. The perfect weather and back drop of the Riverside Markets, added to the festive atmosphere.




